- Hand-painted portrait

Memorials I Would Like:

If Your Pet Passes at Home

Please make a plan for this possibility:

- Pre-purchase a EuthaBag from your veterinarian to have a shroud to place your pet in.
- Keep your pet in a cool, dry location.
- Place absorbent material (towels, pee pads, or sheets) underneath.
- Place your pet in the shroud or wrap them in a sheet or blanket for transport or burial.
- During weekday daytime hours, bring them to your veterinarian for cremation.
- During evenings/weekends, contact the Emergency Clinic at 909 Industrial Blvd, Abilene, TX (325-691-1504) for cremation.
- If choosing burial, check local laws and environmental concerns.
